Friday, July 19th




At Nairobi, we ran to take a second plane, its destination: Entebbe International Airport in Uganda

We visited Lira. After we saw some men playing a game called owecco and some girls playing football.


Sunday, July 21st

We took the breakfast with the teachers of this school in the teachers' room. It was really a king's breakfast.














Aafke gave a french lesson to \$6 about « l'accord du participe passé ». After, we gave our exercices we had prepared.

For Paul, it was his first lesson too; a physics lesson for \$1 and a chemistry practical for \$4.










Saturday, July 27th




Saturday, August 3rd





















We did a cruise on the Nile, it was the opportunity to see other animals like hippopotamus or crocodiles. Birds are also impressive and beautiful.

Monday, August 11th






For our last day, we played pétanque and swam in the swiming pool. We went to a beach on Lake Victoria. It was a relaxing day before coming back to France.





The return: Monday night and Tuesday, August 13th










